Results:

November 28, 2009: The Georgian Grizzlies picked up a sweep of their OCAA basketball league games tonight at the Barrie campus. In the women's game, the Grizzlies downed the Loyalist Lancers by a 72-56 score. Dana Marley led all scorers with 17 points and Daniele Horvat added 11. The Grizzlies led 32-26 at the half. Georgian completes the first semester of play with a 3-5 record.

November 21, 2009: The Georgian women's team came close to pulling up an upset on the road on Saturday night against the Algonquin Thunder before falling 63-54. The Grizzlies led by 2 at the break, but could not hold on. After struggling from the free throw line in two previous games, Georgian shot 27/35 from the line. Dana Marley scored 23 points, going 15/16 from the line and Tonya Cailles added 10 points.

In exhibition action on Sunday in Gatineau, the Grizzlies lost 65-42 to Heritage College. Once again Marley led the Grizzlies in scoring with 10 points, while Cailles and Chelsea Sheff each scored 9 points.

The women have a 2-5 league record and will complete the first semester of play next Saturday when they host the Loyalist Lancers at 6:00pm.

November 14, 2009: The Georgian Grizzlies dropped both games of an OCAA basketball doubleheader against the St. Lawrence Vikings on Saturday afternoon. In the women's game, the Vikings broke open a tie game at half-time to defeat the Grizzlies 63-42. Danielle Greek led the Vikings with 17 points and 19 rebounds. Innisfil native Dana Marley led the Grizzlies with 8 points and 19 rebounds. Georgian struggled shooting the ball all afternoon, shooting 20% from the field and only 31% (10/32) from the free throw line. The Grizzlies fall one game below .500 to 2-3.

November 5, 2009: The Georgian men's and women's basketball teams each picked up their first league wins of the season, as they swept the Centennial Colts in OCAA action last night in Barrie.

The women beat Centennial 74-43, holding the Colts to 23% shooting from the field. Dana Marley had 24 points and 11 rebounds to lead the way for Georgian. Three other Grizzlies scored in double figures with Tonya Cailes scoring 11 and Tammie Barriage and Danielle Horvat adding 10 each. The Grizzlies led 33-21 at the half.

October 29, 2009: The Georgian basketball teams lost a doubleheader to the George Brown Huskies last Wednesday evening in Toronto.

The women lost 67-41 to the Huskies after trailing 33-22 at the half. Courtney Okonsky scored 11 points and Dana Marley added 10. Georgian falls to 0-2 in league play.

The Grizzlies received unfortunate news this week that they have lost the services of Summer Bly for the remainder of the year. Bly, the team's leading scorer and rebounder the past two seasons, tore her ACL and part of the MCL in her knee and will now undergo surgery to repair the damage.

Both teams will look to bounce back this week when they host the Centennial Colts on Wednesday and the Fleming Knights on Friday.
