Orangeville Campus receives \$250,000 to run youth employment program

David Tilson, Member of Parliament for Dufferin–Caledon, on behalf of Minister Diane Finley, Minister of Human Resources and Skills Development, announced more than \$250,000 in Youth Skills Link funding to the Step Up Program at Georgian's Orangeville Campus on May 22.

"In today's environment, it is more important than ever that our youth develop the skills needed to participate and succeed in the job market," said Tilson. "We are proud to provide young Canadians with an opportunity to gain the skills, knowledge and work experience they need to reach their full potential."

The Step Up Program will help 45 Dufferin County youth facing employment barriers prepare for and find meaningful employment or return to school.

"The Step Up Program provides an opportunity for youth to explore their career choices, learn workplace skills and connect with local employers," said **Brenda Burman**, Co-ordinator for the College's Centre for Career and Employment Services. "After participating in this type of program, youth are more confident of their skills and have greater success in

finding and keeping a job. Georgian is excited to be able to offer this program to youth in Dufferin County."

Skills Link is part of the Government of Canada's strategy to create the best educated, most skilled

and most flexible workforce in the world. The government underscored its commitment to this strategy in Canada's Economic Action Plan.

A key component of the plan is to create more and better opportunities for Canadian workers through skills development.

Georgian College reinforces its commitment to health and safety

Georgian College has tightened smoking restrictions at all seven of its campuses. As of June 1, smoking will no longer be permitted at any entrances to College buildings and will be restricted to a limited number of designated areas.

Cheryl Simpson, Chair of Georgian’s Smoke-Free Task Team, says the College’s commitment to health and wellness is the driving force behind the policy change.

“The new restrictions are in line with the College’s ongoing efforts to ensure staff members have a safe and healthy place to work and that students have a safe and healthy environment for learning,” said Simpson.

She also noted the College had assistance from the Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit in making changes to the smoking policy. Simpson added it’s no coincidence the timing of the smoking regulations follows World No Tobacco Day, which is on May 31.



“We wanted to reinforce the message that we are simply part of a much bigger global initiative to increase awareness of the health risks posed by second-hand smoke and to promote a healthier environment for all,” she said.

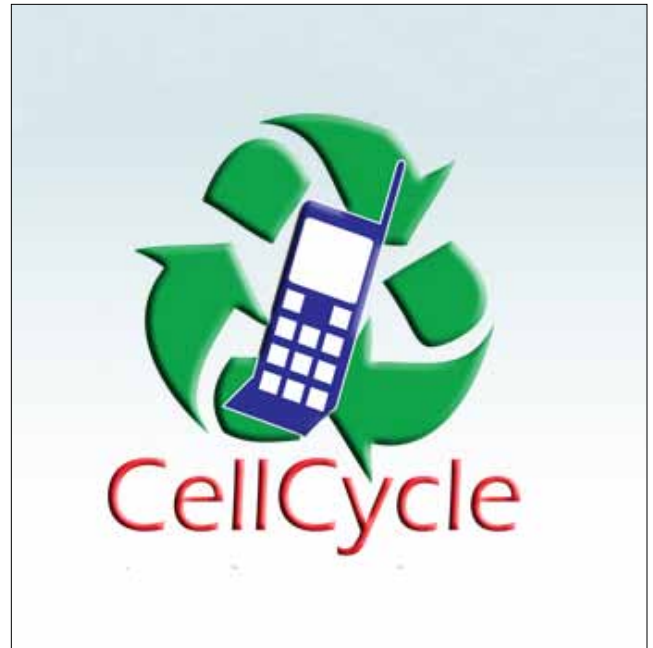
Georgian installs cell phone recycling bin at Campus Connections, Barrie

Cell phones are among the fastest growing streams of electronic waste . . . and the least recycled.

The wireless industry estimates the recycling rate of cell phones in Canada below 12 per cent, with most older, unused phones either collecting dust or being discarded in the trash. With an estimated 15 million wireless telephone subscribers in Canada alone, this represents a significant amount of pollution.

CellCycle, a Barrie-based organization committed to protecting the environment by recycling old cell phones, has installed a unit at the **Barrie Campus**. The unit is located on the first floor of the administrative building at **Campus Connections**. CellCycle will plant a tree for each cell phone collected at any one of its drop boxes located throughout the community.

Other drop-off locations include **Canadian Tire** (320 Bayfield St. and 75 Mapleview Dr. W.) and several **Zehrs** grocery stores in Barrie. Other Georgian campuses are looking into the initiative as well.

Installation of wall-mounted hand sanitizer units

As part of Georgian's continuing efforts to prevent the spread of Influenza and other infections, wall-mounted hand sanitizer units are being installed near entrances to the college at each of the campuses.

The hand sanitizer contains a 60 per cent alcohol content (which meets the standards set out by **Public Health Canada**) and is fragrance-free.

It will be up to individual departments to decide whether to purchase hand sanitizer units for their reception areas. Any hand sanitizers purchased should meet Public Health Canada standards.

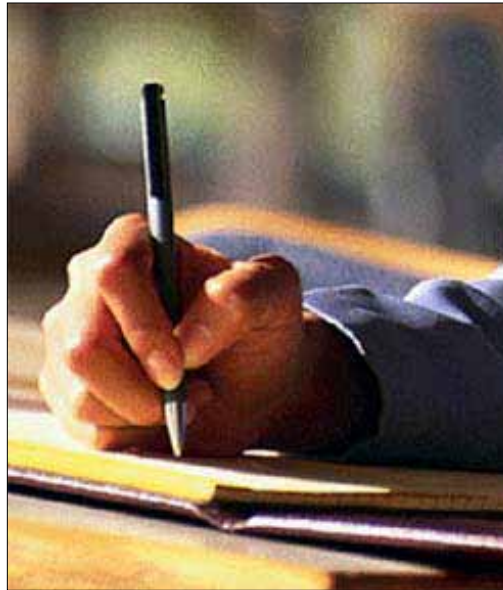

Funds were raised through ticket sales, silent and live auctions and a generous single donation of \$2,000. The popular event sold out quickly. Participants were entertained by **Anneliese Cameron** during a cocktail hour, while **Dr. Bruce Meyer**, a professor with the **University Partnership Centre**, read poetry from several of his more than 30 published books. **Jamie Hall**, B101 FM, was master of ceremonies.

A **Rogers Cable TV** interview with **Kim Brent** talking about her mother's recent breast cancer diagnosis, which aired the day before the event, was shown at the dinner. An orientation video from **The Weekend to End Breast Cancer** featured frequently answered questions about the event as well as testimonials from cancer survivors.

Kim says that participating in this year's **Walk to End Breast Cancer** is especially important to her.

"In addition to the news about my mother's recent diagnosis of breast cancer, my son-in-law was diagnosed with cancer last year and my Uncle Wilf passed away from cancer last week," she said. "This has given me even more reason to do the **Walk to End Breast Cancer** and other fundraisers for cancer research; cancer is hard, walking isn't."

Team Cups and Straps includes Kim, **Carolyn Jones**, **Brittany MacGregor** and **Ingrid Swenker**. They organize several events over the year to raise money for the cause.
