## MOVE-IN INSTRUCTIONS

Move-in day in January is a little different than the main move-in day in September, but it is still any exciting day. Here are a few tips to make move-in easier for you:

- Please do not leave your vehicle unattended unless it's parked in the designated parking lots. It is important that we keep traffic flowing so others can unload their vehicles.
- Do not leave your vehicle unattended in the circle in front of the residence. This area has been designated a fire route and is patrolled by the City of Barrie by-Law Officers. If the officers see an unattended

vehicle they will ticket it (\$150).

- There will be a number of wheeled carts available for use to help you move in, but since all of the residents are returning the same day they will be in demand. To borrow a cart you simply sign one out at the front desk, by leaving your ID with the front desk staff. Your ID will be returned when you return the cart..



- Please visit the residence website to see the list of appliances that are/are not allowed.

- Clearly label your belongings and place them in boxes. Label the boxes with your last name.

Storage space in residence is limited to the students' room, therefore consider taking trunks and suitcases home after unpacking.

- See the checklist on the website to ensure you haven't forgotten anything.
- Please note that GLASS beer bottles are not allowed in residence (cans are allowed). The reasons are:
  1. Bottles get smashed in stairwells and hallways and cause a serious threat to safety.
  2. People save bottles in their rooms for re-funds and they start to smell and attract fruit flies.

## THE PARKING PROCESS

Residence parking is available on a first come first served basis. Copies of the residence parking application form are available on the residence website under "Important Documents". If you require parking while living in residence please complete the application in full and return to the residence office with your full payment. Incomplete residence parking applications will not be processed. The cost for parking for the winter semester is \$271.20 (taxes included) for the 4 month academic period (Jan – April). Short term residence parking is available at a cost of \$5/night when space permits. Please note we do not accept personal cheques.

## RESIDENCE COMMUNITY STANDARDS

Every member of the residence community must accept that certain standards, or rules, need to exist in order for a large group of people to live together and function as a community within a relatively small environment. One must appreciate the effect of his/her behaviour on others and respect their personal and property rights. Georgian college appeals to each resident's sense

of reason, responsibility and consideration for others. Georgian College promotes the ideal that responsibilities are to be shared by everyone in order to maintain a standard of cooperative living, tolerance, mutual respect, and compromise.

In choosing to live in residence, each resident accepts to live by the Code of Honour which values and promotes common courtesy, good citizenship, and responsible behaviour.

## DRIVING DIRECTIONS

Take the Duckworth exit off of Highway 400. Turn onto Georgian Drive and into Georgian College at the gatehouse. As soon as you pass the gatehouse, turn left. Turn left on Residence Road which is just before the parking gates. Follow the road around to the front of the residence and park at the metered parking spots to unload your belongings.
