Admission Requirements

Grade 12 English C or U (ENG4C, ENG4U)

Grade 11 C or U, or 12 U Biology (SBI3U/C, SBI4U) or Grade 12 U Exercise Science (PSE4U)

Grade 11 or 12 U Chemistry or Grade 12 C Chemistry (SCH3U, SCH4C, SCH4U), or Grade 11 or 12 U Physics or Grade 12 C

Physics (SPH3U, SPH4U, SPH4C)

Selection Process

Selection is based on admission requirements and academic grades.

Registration Requirements

Applicants must have an up-to-date immunization record in compliance with the Public Hospitals Act. Completion and submission of this record is required during registration in order to ensure your placement in clinical and field placement facilities.

A Hepatitis B vaccination is required for your own safety. It may be obtained at a reduced cost through the student insurance plan.

Applicants must have successfully completed a CURRENT CARDIAC LIFE SUPPORT CERTIFICATE which includes, theory and practice in artificial respiration, one and two person CPR, infant and child CPR, within the last year, and provide a recent standard first aid certification (Online CPR certifications are not acceptable). Both of these certificates must be presented at registration. CPR must be updated annually while in the program.

Proof of two (1 hour) massage therapy treatments by 2 separate RMTs must be presented at registration.

Students who do not provide this proof of Registration Requirements may be unable to complete clinical and field placements.

External Recognition

Upon graduation from this program you will be recommended to the College of Nurses to write the registration examinations. Successful completion of these examinations and compliance with the Regulated Health Professions Act will entitle you to become a Registered Practical Nurse and thus a member of the College of Nurses of Ontario.

Please note: The College of Nurses of Ontario (CNO), the body responsible for regulating nursing in Ontario, sets entry to practice requirements that nurses and practical nurses must meet to become registered in Ontario. CNO's mission is to regulate nursing to protect the public interest. Among CNO's entry to practice requirements are provisions specifically intended to enhance public safety. These provisions require that applicants for registration in Ontario:
